5 Must Haves for Overnight Guests



If you're not traveling this season, you just might be the one accommodating visits from family and friends. A few \$1 supplies picked up on a quick trip to Dollar Tree can go a long way to help your guests feel right at home — and make your job as host a little easier, too!

1. **Night Lights:** Place them in hallways, bathrooms, and in the kitchen to keep your guests from stubbing their toes or fumbling for light switches. (see image #1)
